

The Key Person Approach

Valuing Individuality

The Key Person approach is important in building a strong and respectful partnership between the setting and parents/carers.

At Punch and Judy Playgroup, each Key Person works closely with the parents/carers to provide each child with quality care and appropriate learning experiences.

You will be introduced to your child's Key Person on admission.

- The Key Person offers warmth and support to the children, helping them to settle quickly into Punch and Judy Playgroup
- They listen to the child's voice and are always patient, kind and fun to be with!
- They are available to regularly listen to and communicate with parents, always respecting confidentiality.
- They provide parents with information on their child's development, with progress meetings in November, March and June.
- They are responsible for completing a Progress Check at Two for all of their key children aged between 24-36 months.

As part of our Playgroup policy ensuring that the individual needs of every child are met, we have a named person responsible for co-ordinating and supporting any additional needs that may be identified.

Our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is Alanna Noonan

And The Outdoors In!




"There is no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong clothes!"



Safeguarding is important to us, and we are committed to protecting the confidentiality of all children and families. FUNDRAISERS

We run termly fundraisers and offer parents and caregivers an opportunity to watch their child(ren) in a short performance followed by fundraising activities. As a charity, these fundraising activities provide donations that go 100% back into the enrichment of the playgroup and help fund activities or new supplies. These invitations also offer excellent opportunities to visit the playgroup, see our facilities, and meet other parents and families. Our playgroup has a positive and inclusive feel.

PARENT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Our Volunteer Management Committee is run by parents and is ALWAYS open for new individuals wanting to help. They make management decisions such as fee increases and opening hours, planning fundraising activities, looking for local grants, ideas for extra activities, or even writing this prospectus!

All of our parents on the committee undergo DBS checks and will receive basic safeguarding training.

TAX-FREE CHILDCARE

For working families, including the self-employed, in the UK

- · Earning under £100k and at least £152 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each
- · Who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers
- · With children aged 0-11 (or 0-16 if disabled)
- · For every £8 you pay into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year



15 HRS FREE CHILDCARE

- For families in England, receiving some forms of support
 With 2-year-old children
- · 15 hours of free childcare or early education for 38 weeks
- To be able to take up 15 hours of free childcare for your two year-old, you or your child must meet the eligibility criteria. Please visit the Government website for more information



15 HRS FREE CHILDCARE

- For all families in England
- · With 3 and 4 year-old children
- · 15 hours of free childcare or early education for 38 weeks
- \cdot A total of 570 hours per year, that you can use flexibly with one or more childcare provider

NOTE: You can access your Free Early Education at any of our session, however, at Punch and Judy, if you choose to take your Free Entitlement over just 2 days per week you will only be able to access a maximum of 13 hours.



30 HRS FREE CHILDCARE

- For working families in England
- · With 3 and 4 year-old children
- · 30 hours of free childcare or early education for 38 weeks
- · A total of 1,140 hours per year, that you can use flexibly with one or more childcare provider
